Angel of Forgetfulness by Steve Stern

In a trilogy of connected stories that revolve around an unfinished manuscript and a fallen angel's relationship with his half-mortal son in 1900 New York, three people depart from their ordinary lives in the wake of a series of extraordinary adventures.

For King & Country by Robert Aspirin

SAS Captain Trevor Stirling journeys back in time to A.D. 500 to prevent a Northern Irish fanatic from carrying out his plan to assassinate Artorius, the Brittanic Lord of Battle, before his greatest military victory.

By a Lady: Being the Adventures of an Enlightened American in Jane Austen's England by Amanda Elyot

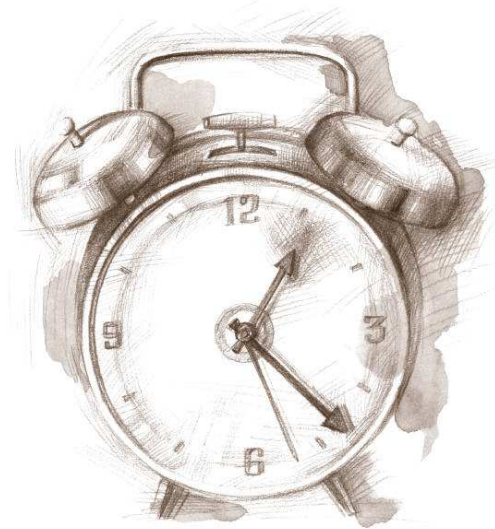
During an audition for a play about Jane Austen, New York actress C. J. Welles is transported back in time to Bath, England, at the turn of the nineteenth century, where she is befriended by the eccentric Lady Euphoria Dalrymple, falls for Owen Percival, the Earl of Darlington, the cousin of Jane Austen, and finds herself torn between two different eras.

Little Book by Selden Edwards

The exiled scion of a prominent Boston family, forty-seven-year-old Wheeler Burden is living in 1988 San Francisco until he is mysteriously transported to fin de siècle Vienna, a city that he finds strangely familiar, where he finds a mentor in Sigmund Freud.

The Map of Time by Félix J. Palma

A skeptical H. G. Wells investigates time-travel mysteries including an aristocrat's love affair with a murdered prostitute from the past, a Victorian woman's escape to the future, and a plot to murder celebrated authors to steal their written works.

The Time Machine by H.G. Wells

Wells's classic novel of the future follows the Time Traveller as he hurtles one million years into the future and encounters the childlike Eloi and the disgusting Morlocks.

Timeline by Michael Crichton

Crichton combines a science of the future -- the emerging field of quantum technology -- with the complex realities of the medieval past.

The Domsday Book by Connie Willis

Journeying back in time to the year 1320, twenty-first century Oxford woman Kivrin arrives in the past during the outbreak of a deadly epidemic.

Pastwatch: the Redemption of Christopher Columbus by Orson Scott Card

In the not-too-distant future, after a scientific innovation allows researchers to open a window on the past, a young woman sends an individual onto a slightly different path in life, interference that has unexpected repercussions for the present and future.

Kindred by Octavia Butler

Dana, a Black woman, finds herself repeatedly transported to the antebellum South, where she must make sure that Rufus, the plantation owner's son, survives to father Dana's ancestor.

Gates of Time series by Dan Parkinson

A man from Lucas Hawthorn's childhood returns as a young man to Lucas's Kansas home and turns it into a time-travel depot for future beings called the Whispers in this funny, imaginative series.

12 Monkeys by Elizabeth Hand

Sent back in time from the year 2035 to 1990 to prevent the apocalypse that destroyed most of the earth, James Cole lands in a psychiatric ward under the care of Dr. Kathryn Railly, who begins to believe his wild story.

Time and Again by Jack Finney

Simon Morley is selected by a secret government agency to test Einstein's theory of the past co-existing with the present and is transported back to 1880s New York.

A Connecticut Yankee in King Arthur's Court

by Mark Twain

A blow to the head transports a Yankee to 528 A.D., where he proceeds to modernize King Arthur's kingdom.

Journey of the Dead by Loren D. Estleman

This depicts an ancient Spanish alchemist searching for the secrets of the gods, and Pat Garrett, the man who killed Billy the Kid, travel together and separately in their quests for answers to age-old questions.

The Accidental Time Machine by Joe Haldeman

Working as a lowly research assistant at MIT, Matt Fuller is working on a project to measure quantum forces related to time changes in gravity and electromagnetic force, when his calibrator is transformed into a time machine.

Breath of Snow and Ashes by Diana Gabaldon

In 1772, on the eve of the American Revolution, Jamie Fraser is asked by the governor to help protect the colonies for King and Crown, but, thanks to his time-traveling twentieth-century wife, Claire, Jamie is aware of the ultimate result of the rebellion.

The Time Traveler's Wife by Audrey Niffenegger

Passionately in love, Clare and Henry vow to hold onto each other and their marriage as they struggle with the effects of Chrono-Displacement Disorder, a condition that casts Henry involuntarily into the world of time travel.
