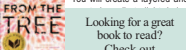

### A message to our community,

If you are not yet familiar with the RFID service at Deer Park Public Library we invite you to review the insert in this newsletter to learn more about it.

With a PIN/Password associated with your library card you have immediate access to your library account. You can skip the line and check out materials yourself. If you need to create a PIN/Password please see the staff at the Circulation Desk, or at the Adult or Children's Reference desks. They can help get you started. You can also create a PIN/Password yourself by accessing the online library catalog.

Our library has joined other Suffolk County libraries in offering a new service of "automatic renewals". When an item becomes due it may automatically renew - but only if there are no holds on the item. There is a one time auto renewal limit for new DVDS, audiobooks and Playaways. There is a limit of 6 renewals for other library materials. This service is meant for your convenience, it does not remove the responsibility of the patron to know when their items must be returned. You may easily check your library record via the library website [deerparklibrary.org](http://deerparklibrary.org), from the library OPAC, or the library Self Check-Out Station.

As always, the library staff is here to help you with RFID, borrowing issues, or whatever questions you may have.

For more than a year the Deer Park Library has been utilizing RFID (Radio Frequency Identification) to circulate our library items.



RFID is the latest technology to be used in library theft detection systems. In addition to better security the use of RFID reduces the amount of time required to perform circulation operations.

All of the tags used in RFID technology for libraries are "passive." The power to read the tags comes from the reader or exit sensor, rather than from a battery within the tag. The RFID readers are highly reliable. Several vendors of RFID library systems claim an almost 100 percent detection rate using RFID tags!

For patrons using self-checkout, there is a marked improvement because they do not have to carefully place materials within a designated template and they can check out several items at the same time.
