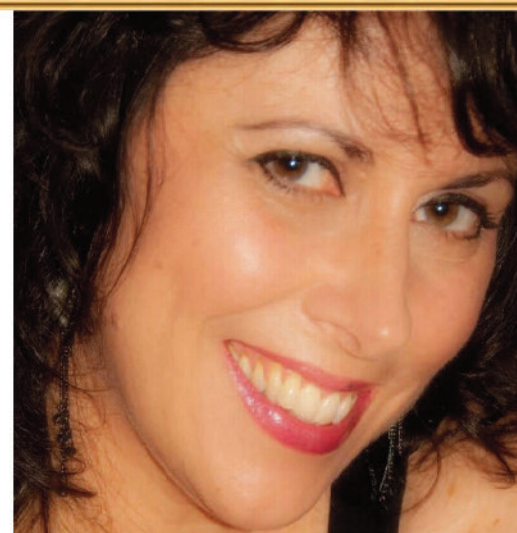

Registration Policy: All program registrations require a valid library card.

First day of registration begins at 9am, in-person for Deer Park Library cardholders ONLY. After 10am, phone and online registrations open for Deer Park Library cardholders.
