Advance registration is mandatory for all programs, unless otherwise noted.

Registration Policy: All program registrations require a valid library card.

Registration dates are listed with program details. Registration is limited to **DEER PARK RESIDENTS ONLY** for the first week. Non-residents may register for any remaining openings **one week after** the first day of registration listed and must possess a valid Suffolk County Library card.

On the first day of registration, you may sign up for programs beginning at 9am in-person, or by phone or online beginning at 10am.

If registering **online** for a program with a fee you may pay by credit/debit card OR pay by check/M.O./cash within 3 days of the day that you registered online or you will be cancelled out of the program. Please note some programs require in-person registration **ONLY** and may require payment by check or money order. Check program description for details. 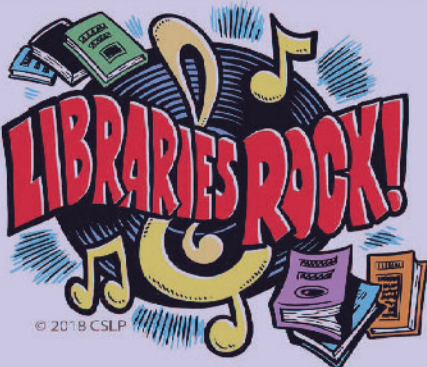
