VOTING IS FOR TWO PURPOSES:

1. Approve the library's Annual Operating Budget.
2. Elect one library trustee to serve a five-year term commencing July 1, 2026, currently held by John Gagliano.

YOU CAN VOTE IF:

- You are a citizen of the United States.
- You are at least eighteen years of age.
- You have been a resident of the Deer Park School District for at least 30 days preceding the vote.
- You are registered to vote (you have voted within the last four years in a general, school or library election).
- The 2026-2027 Proposed Budget will be available online on March 1st, 2026. You can find it on our website or by scanning the QR Code.



IF YOU ARE INTERESTED IN RUNNING FOR OFFICE, YOU MUST:

- Be a current resident of the Deer Park School District and may only be nominated by petition.
- Return a completed petition, signed by at least 25 qualified voters of the school district, to the Director's Office no later than 5pm on March 16th.




DOCUMENTARY SCREENING
